Background on West Virginia Business Report Card

The West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission is pleased to submit the thirteenth annual West Virginia Business Report Card to the Finance Committees of the House of Delegates and the Senate pursuant to West Virginia Code §18B-5-8. This report provides information from the colleges, universities, community and technical colleges, the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission, the West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education, and West Virginia Network for Educational Telecomputing (WVNET) about:

- the number of in-state and out-of-state vendors that the colleges, universities, Commission, Council and WVNET did business with during the 2007 fiscal year;
- the dollar amount paid from state accounts to these vendors; and
- the category of expenditures for which payments were made.

Data in this year's Report Card indicates that during the 2007 fiscal year, the Commission, Council, WVNET, the colleges, universities and community and technical colleges:

- conducted business with 12,088 vendors; and
- paid more than \$462.8 million to all vendors for goods and services.

West Virginia Business Report Card Format, Organization and Data

<u>General Comments</u>: This year, the Business Report Card is presented in a different format than in previous years. The institution reports in this year's Report Card were compiled entirely from financial data in WVFIMS, the accounting system used by state agencies. In previous years reports were compiled from a combination of data from WVFIMS and the institutions' financial systems.

Also, instead of printing the detailed institution reports on paper, most are now on-line and can be accessed by clicking on the institution name in the Consolidated Report on page 6.

In addition, we have dropped the designation of "Out-of-State Vendors with WV Branches". Vendors this year are either designated as instate or out-of-state, depending on the address in WVFIMS that is used to remit payments.

The Report Card is organized around the Department of Administration's object categories and object classes which are updated every year and are published prior to the beginning of each fiscal year in the Expenditure Schedule Instructions. Not all object categories are included in the Report Card, only those that may deal with vendor expenditures. For example, personal services, emplovee benefits, emplovee travel reimbursement, and most other non-vendor classifications are excluded; although, some employee reimbursements, intra-government transfers (those between state agencies) and internal accounting adjustments do appear in the Report Card if the expenditures are coded in the object classifications listed below. All of the reports are divided into three main column headings which are titled:

- "West Virginia Vendors" -- includes vendors with a West Virginia "remit to" address.
- "Out-of-State Vendors" -- includes vendors with an out-of-state "remit to" address.
- "Totals for all Vendors" -- reported in this column are the totals for all vendors.

Under the main column headings summarized above are three identical subheadings:

• "Amount" -- identifies the total dollars expended.

- "Percent" -- shows the percentage of the total dollars going to vendors for that particular grouping (object code).
- "Number" -- shows the number of vendors or the number of transactions in the grouping (object code), depending on the report.

<u>Summary Reports (in this booklet and on-line)</u>: There are three summary reports listed below which include:


- Consolidated Report for Higher Education (in this booklet): This report aggregates the figures of the colleges, universities, community and technical colleges, the Commission, Council and WVNET, and presents consolidated totals and summaries for FY 2007. By clicking on the institution name, you can drill down to individual institution reports. When you click on the "Fiscal Year Total" at the bottom of the page, you can see total higher education expenditures by object code and then use this report to drill down further by clicking on "Alphabetic List of Vendors" at the top. From this report, you can then sort by dollar amount and number of transactions.
- Summary of Expenditures for the Colleges, Universities, Community and Technical Colleges Commission, Council and WVNET, by Object Code (on-line report - click on the institution name): These are the highest level institution summary by object code for the individual colleges, universities, community and technical colleges, the Commission, Council and WVNET. In this report you can see the vendors and dollar amounts that comprise the totals for each object code by clicking on the object code name. At the top of the report you can click on the "Alphabetic List of Vendors" and see the vendors sorted in alphabetical order, which in turn can be sorted by dollar amount and number of transactions.

Observations

Out of a total of 61 object codes included in this report, those in the Current Expenses object class account for the majority of dollars spent by the institutions.

As shown in the pie chart below, out of total expenditures of \$462,801,725:

- Current Expenses object codes account for \$244,427,875, which is 53% of the total dollars spent by higher education institutions.
- Repairs and Alterations object codes account for \$18,816,028, 4% of the total higher education expenditures.
- Asset object codes account for \$197,962,840, 43% of total expenditures.
- Other Disbursement object codes account for \$1,594,982, which is less than 1% of total expenditures.




The bar chart on the next page shows the following with respect to expenditures to instate and out-of-state vendors:

• For Current Expense expenditures,

\$76,055,338 (31%) was paid to in-state vendors and \$168,372,537 (69%) to out-of-state vendors.

- For Repairs and Alterations expenditures, \$5,317,340 (2%) was paid to in-state vendors and \$13,498,688 (5%) was paid to out-of-state vendors.
- For Assets expenditures, \$79,036,851 (32%) was paid to in-state vendors and \$118,925,989 (49%) was paid to out-of-state vendors.
- For Other Disbursements, \$1,479,290 (1%) was paid to in-state vendors and \$115,692 (less than 1%) was paid to out-of-state vendors.
- Total expenditures for all categories totaled \$462,801,725. In-state vendors received \$161,888,819 (35%) and out-of-state vendors received \$300,912,906 (65%) of total expenditures. (*It should be noted that purchasing card payments to Citigroup, the state's P-card vendor, show up as payments to an out-of-state vendor since the payments are sent to an out-of-state address. Many of the actual purchases are from in-state vendors that were paid with the P-card.)*



Recommendations for Improving Purchasing Procedures

The Commission and Council are seeking legislation that would allow them to enter into lease/purchase agreements on their behalf and on behalf for the institutions. Due to budget pressures, many institutions have difficulty paying the full purchase price to buy new or replace outdated academic, research and information technology equipment, and certain capital improvements so these purchases are often postponed for many years. As a result, the quality and relevancy of instruction suffers and deferred maintenance increases. A statewide lease/purchase program would allow the institutions to spread the cost of purchasing this equipment over several years thereby making the purchase less of a budget hardship in a single year. A state-wide program would also take advantage of economies of scale in the cost of financing that the individual institutions cannot achieve on their own. The program would be available to both the baccalaureate institutions and the community and technical colleges and would be set up as tax exempt financing with a three to five year term on a lease/purchase contract. This initiative would not require a legislative appropriation and only minor changes in existing statutes would be needed to implement the program.
