



DRS College/Training Supports

✓ Reasonable Accommodations

Educational accommodations may include accessible classrooms, modified instruction, modified curricula, modified class schedule, extra time for tests, preferential seating, large print materials, written copies of oral material

Accommodations are provided only when a student discloses his or her disability and requests them.

Open communication with professors and the disability services staff can facilitate the process of evaluating the effectiveness of accommodations and of making changes when efforts are not working.

DRS College/Training Supports

- ✓ Coordination with Disability Services office
 - Can accept referrals on struggling students that are not already clients
 - Help in obtaining current Diagnostics
 - Prescriptive information regarding accommodations
 - What can we share and how?

Determining DRS Sponsorship

☐ The Rehabilitation Counselor utilizes the Student Financial Plan (WVDRS-87) to determine if the individual's training costs have been met.

☐ The Rehabilitation Counselor will consider sponsorship based on the need as identified on the Student Financial Plan (WVDRS-87)

DRS College Education Services FY 2014

Assisted <u>2,430</u> students with college education services needed to meet their work-related educational goals.

□ Authorized expenditures of more than \$9.4 million in tuition and other college expenses.

DRS Transition Statistics Fiscal Year 2014

- 7,055 students with disabilities (ages 16 to 21) were served.
- 5,085 transition students were referred directly from the schools to DRS.

- 1,172 students with disabilities developed individualized plans for employment.
- 728 transition clients gained employment.



- ✓ Establishes and maintains a working relationship with the registrar, bursars office, and FAO.
- ✓ Has an understanding of the training institutions' programs, and disability services.
- ✓ Disseminates information to other Rehabilitation Counselors




