Purpose of the Report

To provide information on the number of graduates of public high schools who were accepted at West Virginia public institutions of higher education within one year of graduation, and whose knowledge, skill and competency were below the minimum expected levels for full preparation as defined by the governing boards.



Focus of the Report

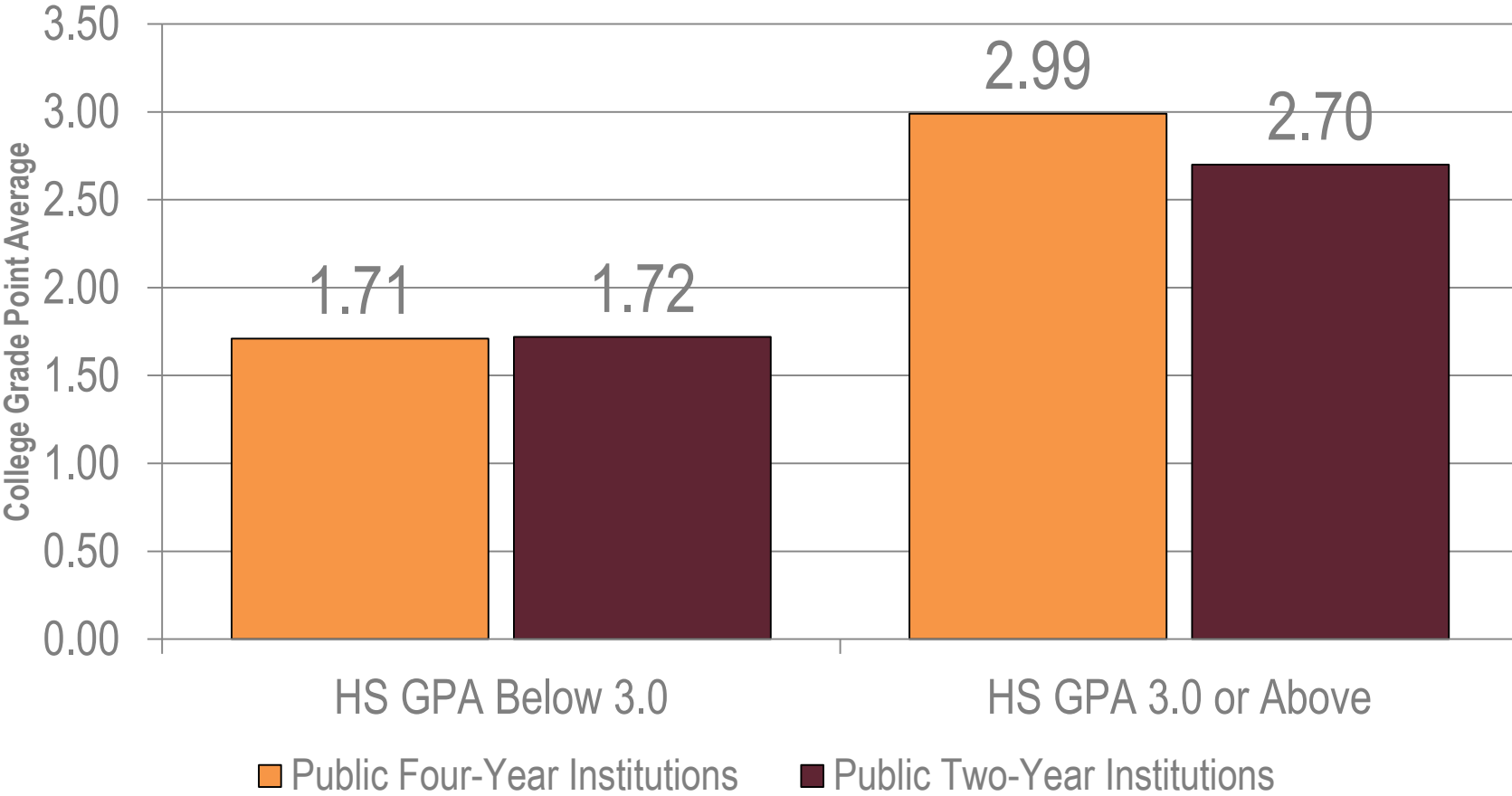
For 2016 high school graduating cohort:

- Percentage meeting ACT college readiness benchmarks.



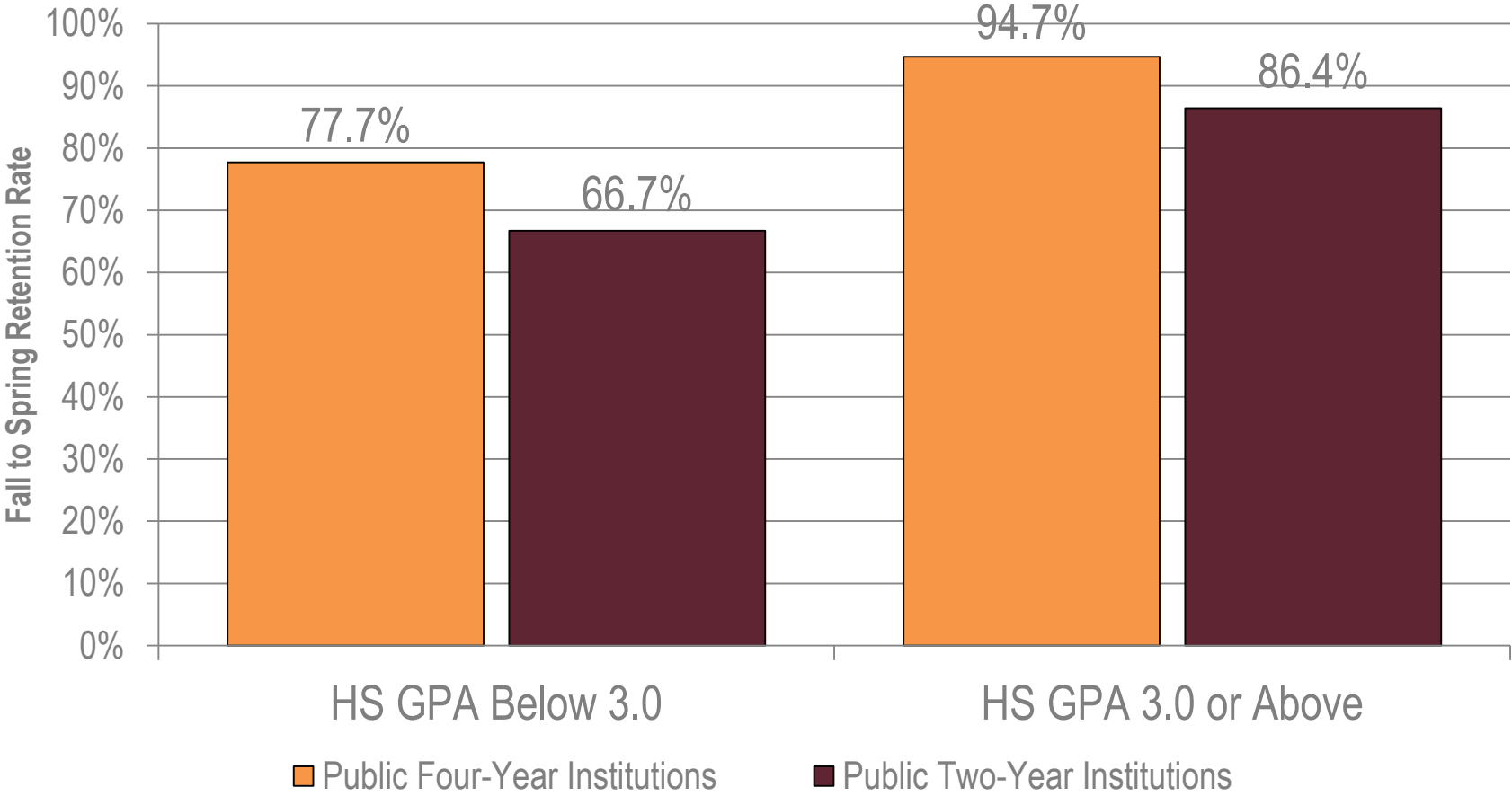
Fall Grade Point Averages

for 2016 High School Graduates, by Higher Education Sector



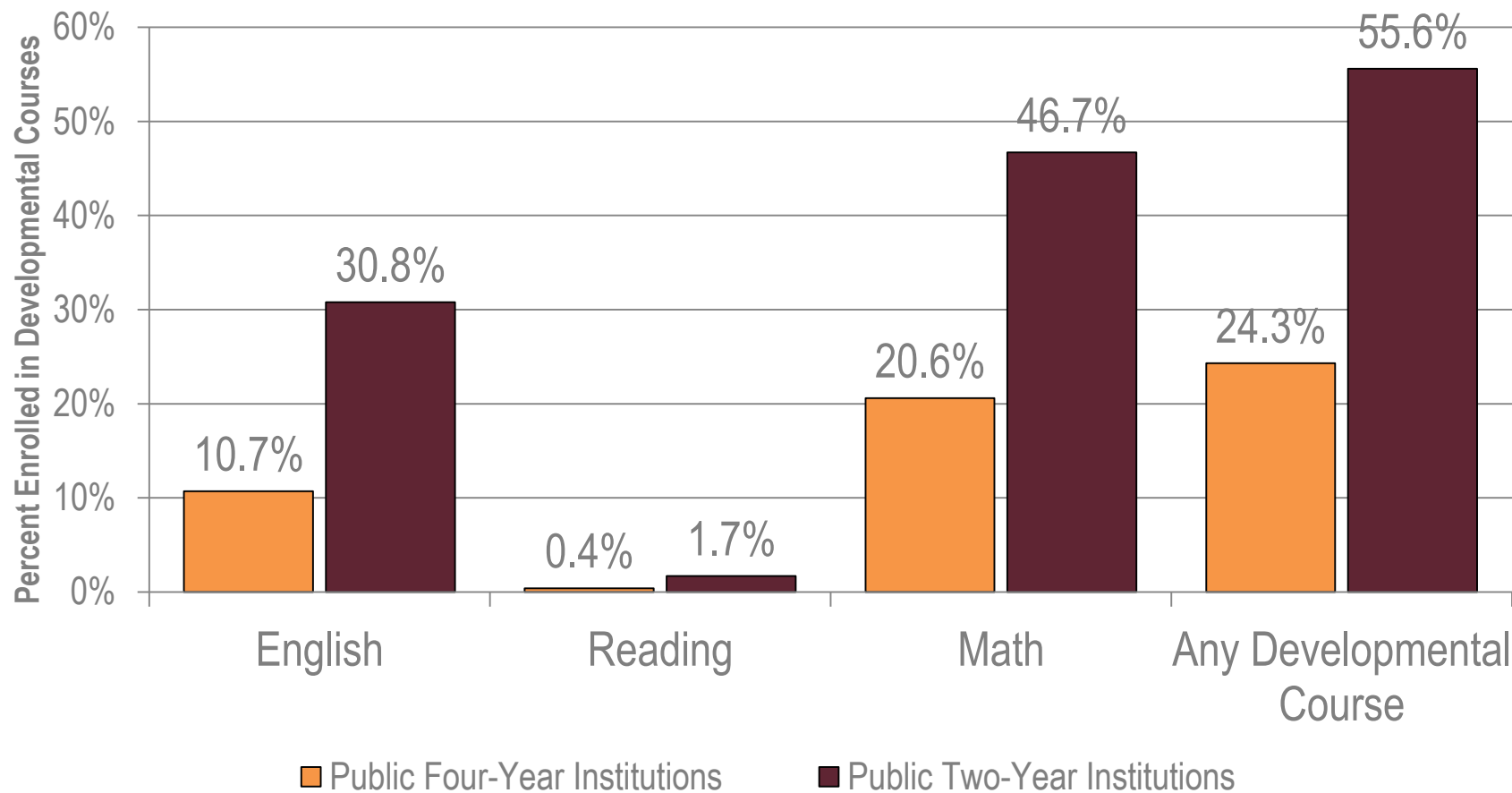
Fall to Spring College Retention Rates

for 2016 High School Graduates, by Higher Education Sector



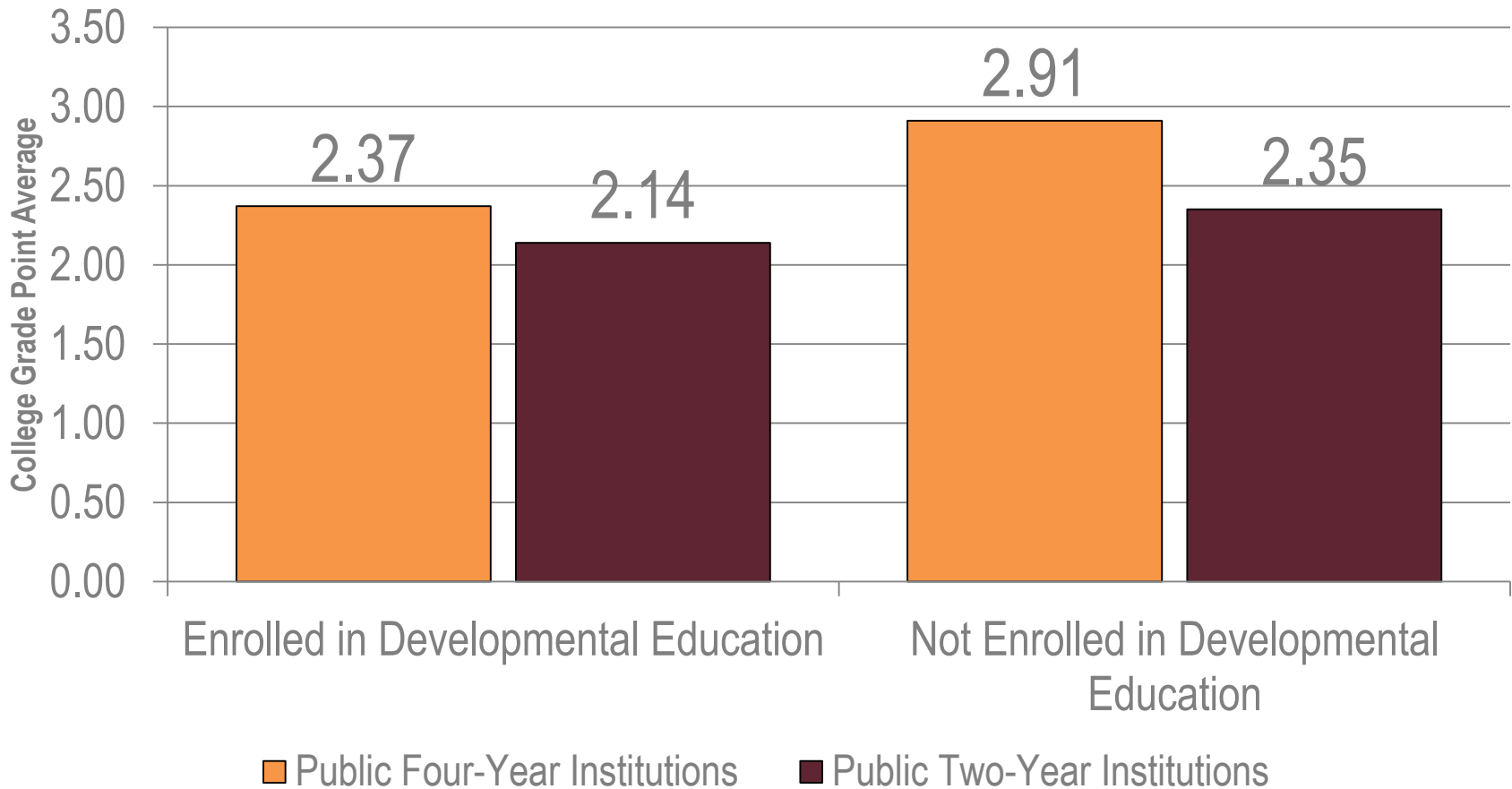
Developmental Education Enrollment

for 2016 High School Graduates, by Higher Education Sector



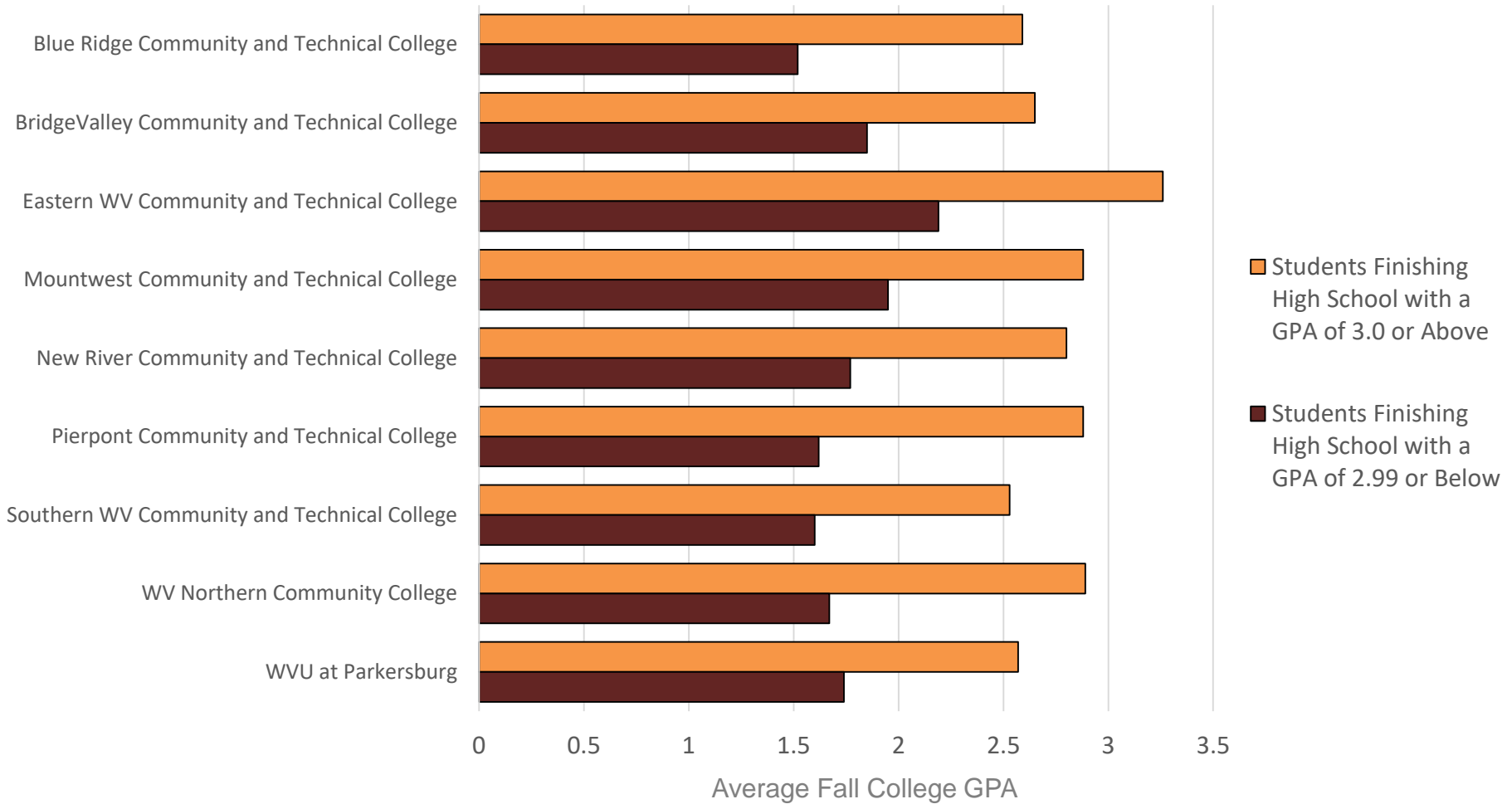
Fall Grade Point Averages

for 2016 High School Graduates, by Higher Education Sector and Developmental Education Enrollment Status



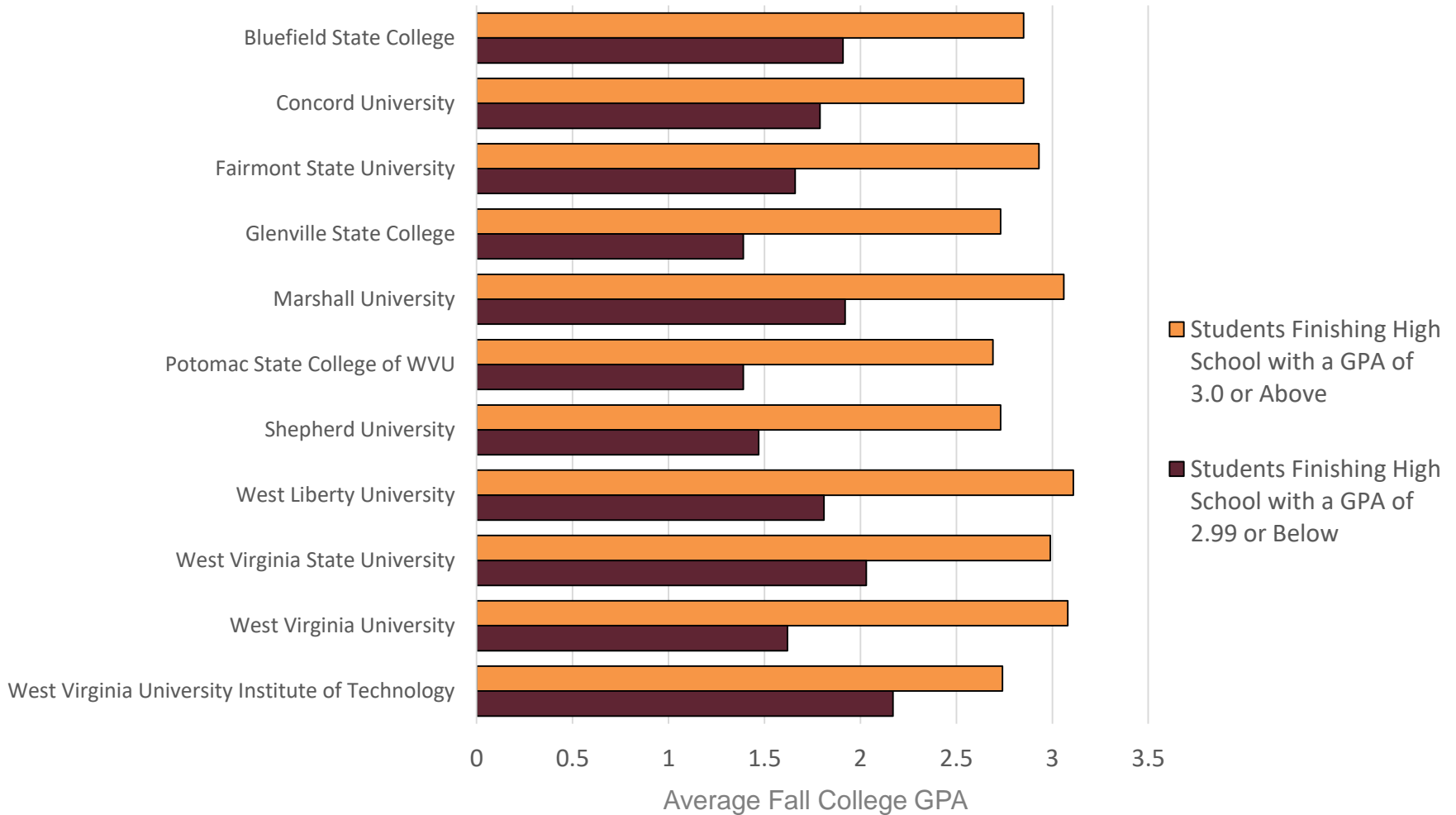
Fall Grade Point Averages

for 2016 High School Graduates, by Institution and High School GPA



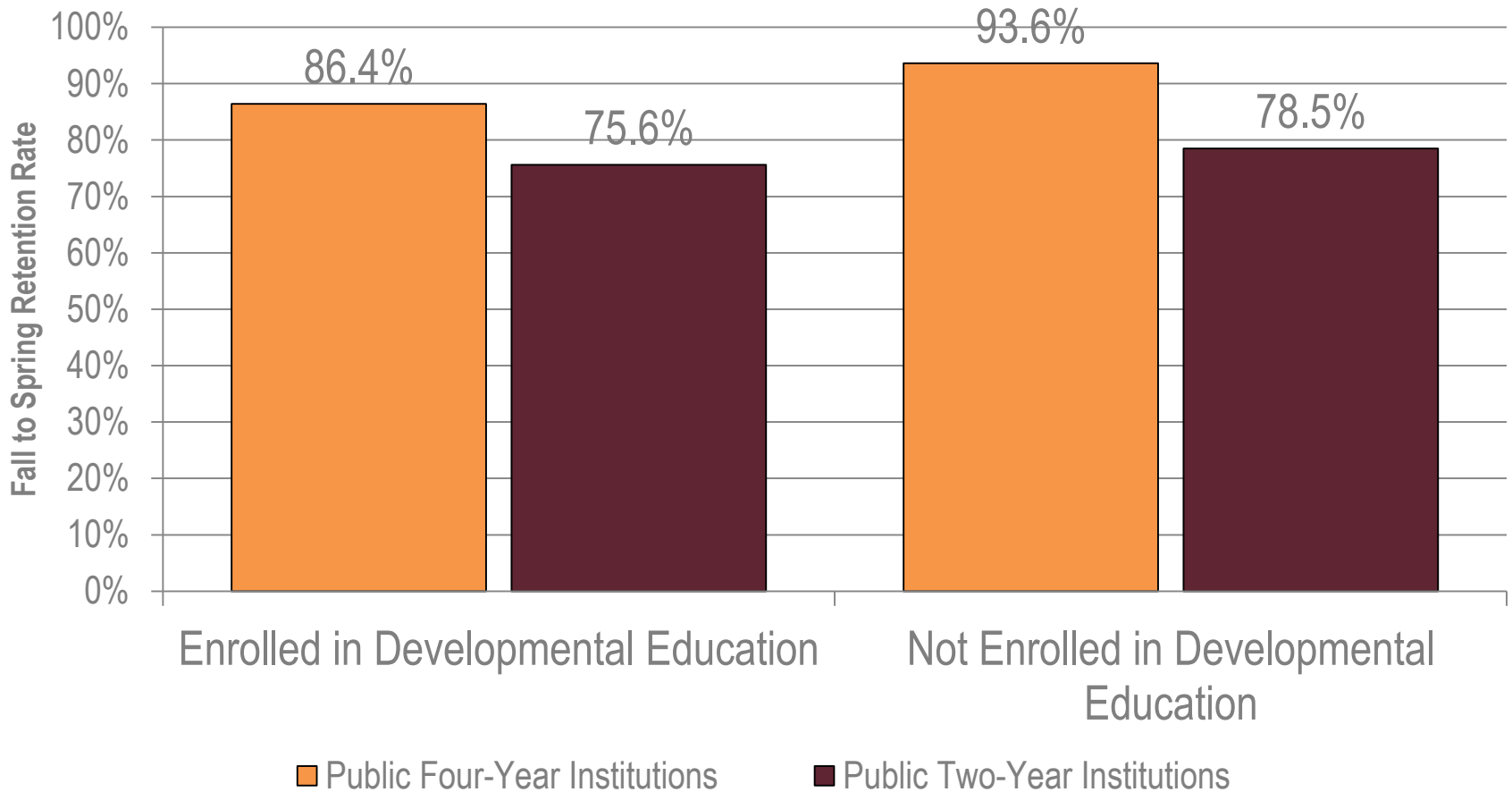

for 2016 High School Graduates, by Higher Education Sector and Developmental Education Enrollment Status



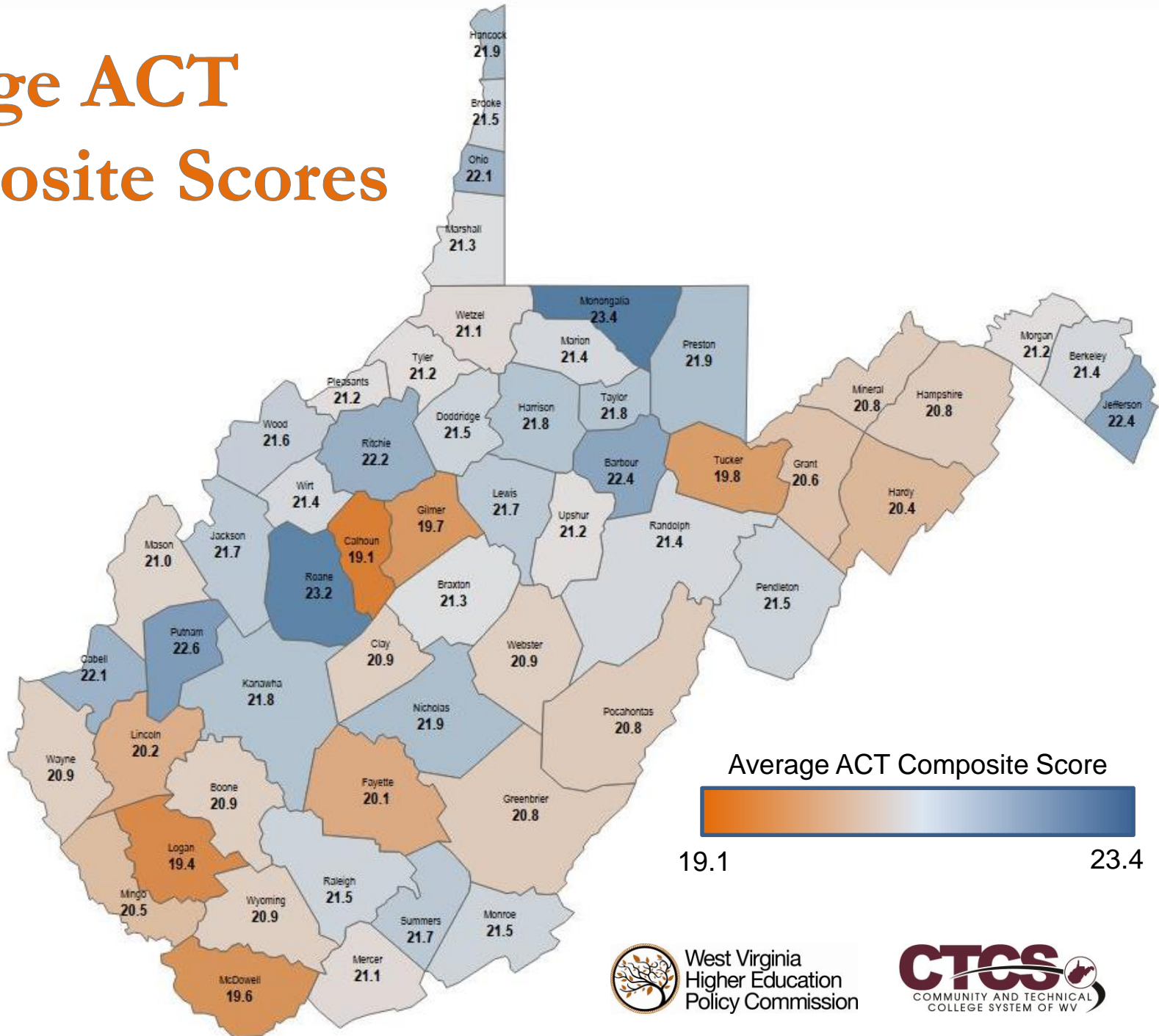

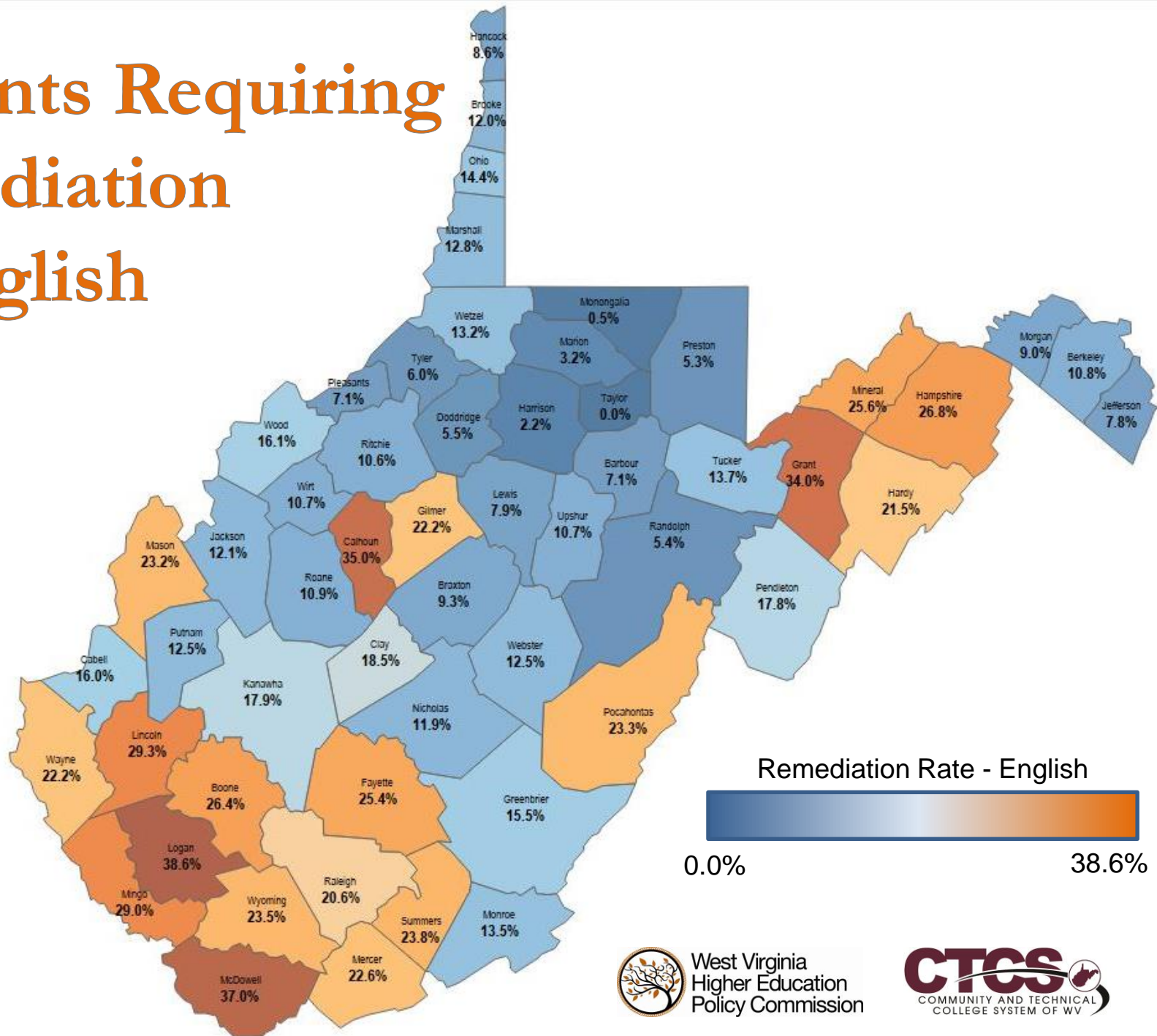

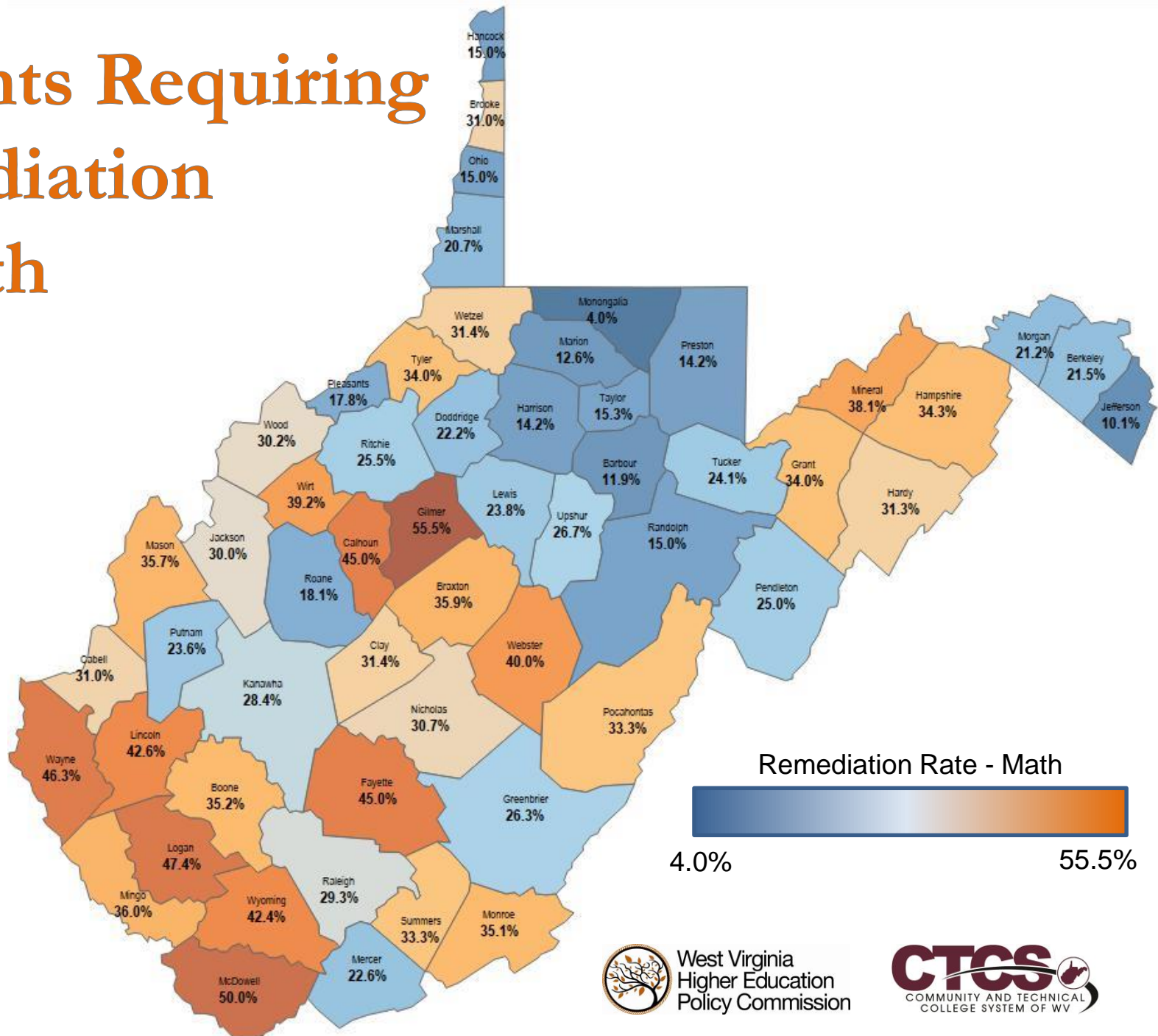
Students Requiring Remediation in English

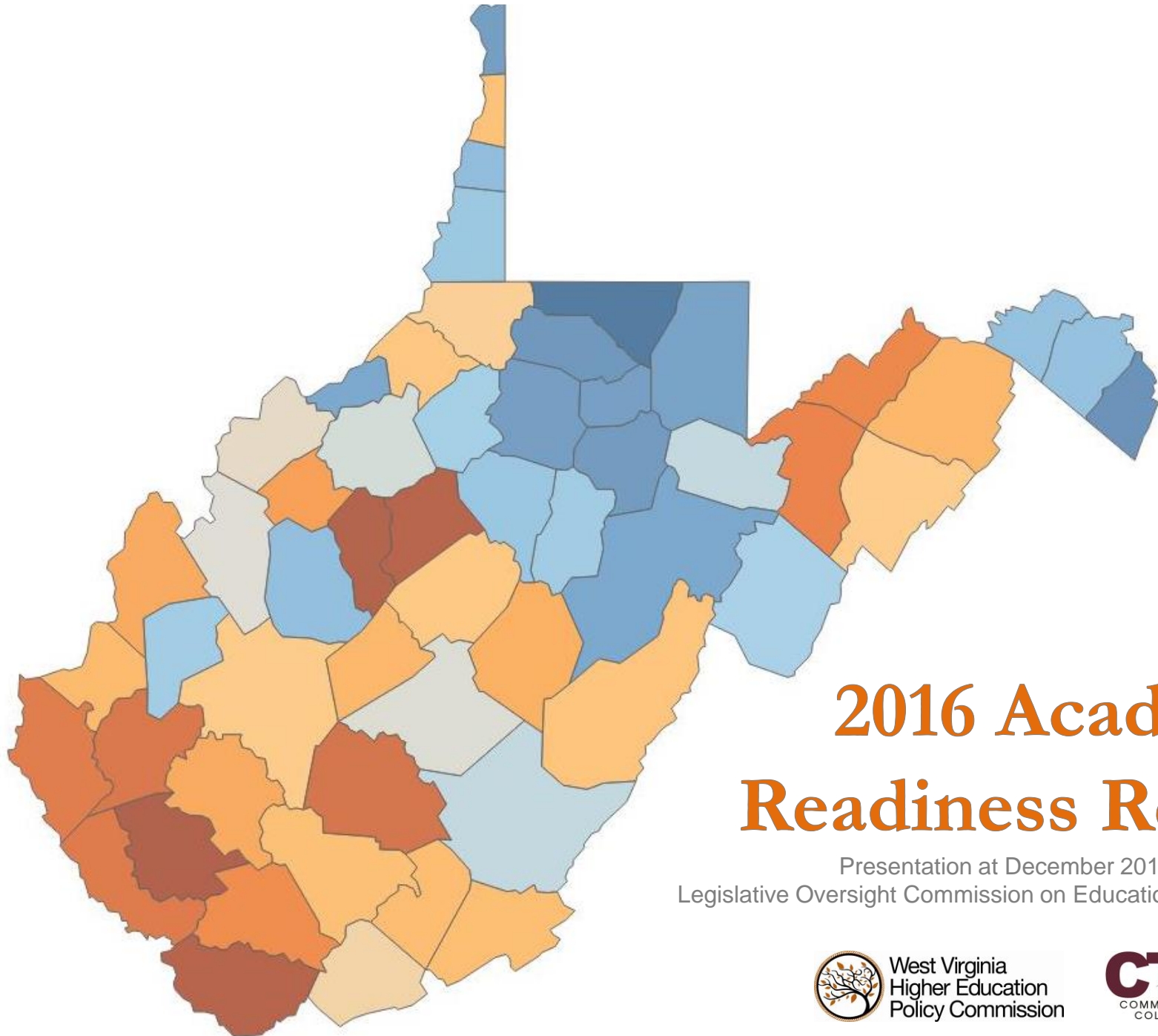
By County
