A STEADFAST FOCUS ON FUTURE

Higher education is a powerful engine for positive change. For those who earn degrees, as well as the people and communities that benefit from their achievements, a college education is transformative. That's why our mission is to help more West Virginians pursue and succeed in postsecondary education. This year, though, that critical mission became more challenging than ever, as the COVID-19 pandemic changed the way we live – and the way we learn.

Throughout this crisis, our state's public higher education institutions worked as a truly synchronous team. From the highest levels of leadership, they came together to share best practices, ask each other questions, and learn some tough lessons together along the way. The result was a creative, nimble response to an unparalleled challenge, and an inspiring dedication to the communities we serve.

Beginning with the extension of spring break, our faculty and staff worked hard to pivot to virtual classes by early April, and our students adapted quickly to that change. At the statewide level, we understood the challenges associated with this swift change - and we worked together with our schools to help address them leading into the fall.

We conducted professional development webinars to help faculty improve online teaching and worked with institutions to refine course scheduling for greater efficiencies. For our students, we held dozens of webinars about financial aid, college admissions, and ACT and SAT test preparation. We modified financial aid programs to help more students qualify. We provided mental health resources for our campuses. And for everyone's protection, we coordinated with the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources and West Virginia National Guard to help campuses sanitize, access protective equipment, and ensure the highest levels of campus safety.

The safeguards our institutions put in place were inventive and comprehensive. From transportable plexiglass shields, to masks, physical distancing and hybrid courses, students returned to their studies in varying ways – but always with their health as the foremost priority. With strong support from Governor Jim Justice, our institutions COVID-19 tested all students and staff prior to the fall return. As a result of these efforts, less than 2 percent of our campus community members tested positive for COVID-19 this fall.

We did all of this, together, because we know our students' futures – and our state's future – are at stake. Research has shown those most negatively affected by the pandemic are people without college degrees. So, it is imperative perhaps more imperative than ever - we help more West Virginians access and succeed in higher education.

By continuing our close work together – as institutions, agencies, and partners - we can help more West Virginians achieve their college and career dreams, and help our state emerge from this crisis even stronger.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS

CAMPUS SUPPORT OF LOCAL COMMUNITIES

Early on in the COVID-19 crisis, West Virginia's frontline healthcare providers faced a shortage of personal protective equipment. In response, the state's two- and four-year institutions – even though their doors were essentially otherwise closed – began using their expertise and 3D printing equipment to manufacture face masks and shields for the medical



community in coordination with the West Virginia National Guard. Further demonstrating their commitment to the communities that surround them, public higher education institutions helped bridge the homework gap by becoming hotspot sites as part of Governor Jim Justice's Kids Connect initiative, which provides broadband access to K-12 and college students statewide.

FIRST COHORT OF UNDERWOOD **SMITH TEACHING SCHOLARS**

In summer 2020, the Commission unveiled West Virginia's inaugural cohort of Underwood-Smith Teaching Scholars. Established by the Legislature in 2019, this is a competitive scholarship for recent high school graduates with a passion for teaching and a history of high academic achievement, community service, and active involvement in extracurricular activities while in high school. Recipients receive \$10,000 per year for up to four years. In exchange, they agree to



teach in a West Virginia public school in an area of critical need - math, science, elementary education, or special education - for at least five years after graduation. The first cohort of 25 scholars, who began their studies in fall 2020, were honored with a virtual celebration in July. More information is available at teachinwy.com.

COLLEGE REMINDERS VIA TEXT MESSAGE

The state's "Txt 4 Success" program is currently helping more than 27,000 high school seniors and college freshmen stay on track for college with reminders via text message. High school seniors and first-year college students are eligible – and encouraged – to sign up for the texting program. The messages, which typically total two or three texts per month, serve as general college reminders highlighting key deadlines, as well as regular check-ins to make

sure students are transitioning well into college life. Students who sign up can also use the service to ask questions, which are answered by a team of nearly 50 college access advisors across the state. Students can sign up to receive the alerts by visiting the state's free college-planning resource, cfwv.com.





NEW STUDENT SUCCESS INITIATIVES



West Virginia's higher education agencies announced in June 2020 that Ascendium Education Group awarded the state \$750,000 to support student success and accelerate degree completion. In line with West Virginia's Climb initiative, which seeks to arm 60 percent of the state's workforce with a

postsecondary credential by 2030, this program will provide tools and resources for rural students, first-generation students, and students from low-income backgrounds. To build on this investment, the state is collaborating with Philanthropy West Virginia and its member foundations and companies that are committed to meeting the state's most urgent educational needs through collaborative grantmaking.

In January 2020, West Virginia's Community and Technical College System announced that it was awarded a nearly \$4.2 million grant from Arnold Ventures to pilot a program at West Virginia University at Parkersburg and Blue Ridge Community and Technical College that supports students as they work toward their credentials. Today, West Virginia's "Ascend" program is providing academic, personal, and financial supports to help students at those two institutions complete their degrees in high-demand fields, such as advanced manufacturing, information technology, welding, and health care. If effective, the system will work to scale the program to all two-year institutions across the state.

WEST VIRGINIA HIGHER EDUCATION

This is particularly important when it comes to the cohort, or group of students, of which the statistic is reflective. For example, there are fundamental differences between "full-time" and "part-time" students that can have a drastic effect on the reported data.

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


FOUR-YEAR INSTITUTIONS





Annualized Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment values represent the sum of all credit hours generated by undergraduate students enrolled in credit-bearing classes, divided by 30, and the sum of credit hours generated by graduate students in credit-bearing classes, divided by 24, during the fall, spring and summer terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

FALL FRESHMAN CLASS PROFILE

2019-20 Academic Year | Fall End-of-term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of first-time, full- and part-time, associate or bachelor's degree-seeking freshmen matriculating in the fall semester of an academic year. Featured characteristics include gender, race/ethnicity, West Virginia residency status, percentage scoring at or above college-ready benchmarks in the English and Math sections of the SAT (based only on those freshmen who submitted SAT scores), percentage receiving financial aid through the West Virginia PROMISE Scholarship or federal Pell Grant programs, and the percentage who earned college credit while in high school through programs such as dual enrollment, Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB).

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT PROFILE

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all credit-seeking undergraduate students within an academic year at a given institution.

MINORITY STUDENTS

Students with racial or ethnic minority status are those who self-identify as Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Black or African-American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, or multi-racial.

PART-TIME STUDENTS

A part-time student is defined as an undergraduate student enrolling in fewer than 12 credit hours, or a graduate student enrolling in fewer than 9 credit hours, in a semester.

FALL-TO-FALL RETENTION

Fall 2018 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled the following fall at the same institution.

FALL-TO-SPRING RETENTION

Fall 2019 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled in the spring semester of the same academic year at the same institution.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING 30 HOURS

Fall 2019 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who successfully completed 30 credit hours by the end of the following summer.

BACHELOR'S GRADUATION RATES (FOUR- AND SIX-YEAR)

Fall 2014 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time bachelor's degree-seeking freshmen in a fall entry cohort who earned a bachelor's degree at any public West Virginia institution within four and six years of initial enrollment.

DEGREES AWARDED

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

These values represent the total number of academic credentials at the certificate, associate, bachelor's, master's, post-master's certificate, and doctoral levels awarded by an institution within an academic year. Students earning multiple credentials within an academic year are counted more than once.

GRADUATING CLASS PROFILE

2019-20 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all bachelor's degree recipients within an academic year. The values for Potomac State College of WVU reflect associate degree earners. Gender, minority status and West Virginia residency status reflect all graduates. Academic characteristics including average college GPA, years to degree, and credit hours earned are calculated only for graduates who are earning their first bachelor's degree and have started as a first-time freshman at any public in-state institution.

FINANCIAL AID PARTICIPATION RATE

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure represents the percentage of students receiving federal, state, or institutional grants or waivers divided by the annual unduplicated headcount for the year. It does not include veterans' benefits, vocational rehabilitation benefits, other educational benefits, or loans, but does include work study.

GRADUATE INDEBTEDNESS

2019-20 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides data on the percentage of bachelor's degree earners within an academic year who graduated with student loan debt, along with the average total student loan debt that accumulated as of the student's graduation date. The values for Potomac State College of WVU reflect associate degree earners.

THREE-YEAR STUDENT LOAN DEFAULT RATE

2017 Repayment Cohort | U.S. Department of Education

This measure provides the percentage of a school's borrowers who entered repayment on certain Federal Family Education Loans and/or William D. Ford Federal Direct Loans in the 2017 fiscal year and entered default status within a three-year period. Potomac State College of WVU and WVU Institute of Technology rates are reported as part of the default rate for the main campus of WVU.

WORKFORCE OUTCOMES

2015 Graduates | Institutional Data Submissions; Workforce West Virginia

This section provides the percentage of all recent graduates who earned wages in West Virginia two and four years after graduation, and the median wages earned by bachelor's and master's degree recipients two and four years after graduation. The values for Potomac State College of WVU reflect associate degree earners. Median wages are calculated based on those graduates earning wages within all four quarters of a calendar year. These wages do not include graduates who are employed outside of West Virginia, are self-employed, did not earn wages in each of the four quarters of the calendar year, are clergy, are members of the military, or work for the federal government. To protect student privacy, workforce data may be suppressed or unpublished for institutions with small numbers of graduates in the workforce.

TOP 5 CERTIFICATES AND DEGREES AWARDED

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This list reflects the five most common fields of study based on the total number of academic certificates and associate degrees awarded within an academic year. Fields of study are categorized using the U.S. Department of Education's Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) codes and associated disciplines.

STUDENT TO FACULTY RATIO

2018-19 Academic Year | Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)

This metric is calculated by dividing total full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment by total FTE for instructional staff.

TOTAL ANNUAL HEADCOUNT

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

Annualized headcount enrollment values represent the total number of unique students who enrolled in credit-bearing classes during the fall, spring and summer terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

DUAL ENROLLMENT HEADCOUNT

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure reflects the percentage of the institution's total annualized headcount enrollment that is comprised of high school students enrolled in college classes while still in high school.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) ENROLLMENT

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

Annualized Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment values represent the sum of all credit hours generated by students enrolled in credit-bearing classes, divided by 30, during the fall, spring and summer terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

FALL FRESHMAN CLASS PROFILE

2019-20 Academic Year | Fall End-of-term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of first-time, full- and part-time, certificate-, associate degree- or bachelor's degree-seeking freshmen matriculating in the fall semester of an academic year. Featured characteristics include gender, race/ethnicity, West Virginia residency status, percentage receiving financial aid through the federal Pell Grant program, and the percentage who earned college credit while in high school through programs such as dual enrollment, Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB).

STUDENT PROFILE

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all credit-seeking students within an academic year at a given institution, excluding students enrolled solely in workforce development courses.

MINORITY STUDENTS

Students with racial or ethnic minority status are those who self-identify as Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Black or African-American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, or multi-racial.

PART-TIME STUDENTS

A part-time student is defined as an undergraduate student enrolling in fewer than 12 credit hours in a semester.

FALL-TO-FALL RETENTION

Fall 2018 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled the following fall at the same institution.

FALL-TO-SPRING RETENTION

Fall 2019 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled in the spring semester of the same academic year at the same institution.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING 15 HOURS IN FIRST SEMESTER

Fall 2019 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who successfully completed 15 credit hours by the end of the fall semester.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING MATH/ENGLISH COREQUISITE COURSEWORK

Fall 2018 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who were required to enroll in a corequisite math or English course and successfully completed these courses within two years of enrollment.

TRANSFERRED TO BACHELOR'S PROGRAM

Fall 2018 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator represents the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who were enrolled in a bachelor's degree program by the end of the following academic year.

ASSOCIATE GRADUATION RATES (TWO- AND THREE-YEAR)

Fall 2017 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time associate degree-seeking freshmen in a fall entry cohort who earned an associate degree at any public West Virginia institution within two and three years of initial enrollment.

DEGREES AWARDED

2019-20 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

These values represent the total number of academic credentials at the certificate, associate and bachelor's levels awarded by an institution within an academic year. Students earning multiple credentials within an academic year are counted more than once.

GRADUATING CLASS PROFILE

2019-20 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all associate degree recipients within an academic year. Gender, minority status and West Virginia residency status reflect all graduates. Academic characteristics including average college GPA, years to degree, and credit hours earned are calculated only for graduates who are earning their first associate degree and have started as a first-time freshman at any public in-state institution.

FINANCIAL AID PARTICIPATION RATE

2018-19 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure represents the percentage of students receiving federal, state, or institutional grants or waivers divided by the annual unduplicated headcount for the year. It does not include veterans' benefits, vocational rehabilitation benefits, other educational benefits, or loans, but does include work study.

GRADUATE INDEBTEDNESS

2019-20 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides data on the percentage of associate degree earners within an academic year who graduated with student loan debt, along with the average total student loan debt that accumulated as of the student's graduation date.

THREE-YEAR STUDENT LOAN DEFAULT RATE

2017 Repayment Cohort | U.S. Department of Education

This measure provides the percentage of a school's borrowers who entered repayment on certain Federal Family Education Loans and/ or William D. Ford Federal Direct Loans in the 2017 fiscal year and entered default status within a three-year period.
