
Critical and Growing Need

Key Components

The Behavioral Health Workforce Initiative will:

- Implement a strategic plan to grow and strengthen the behavioral health workforce in collaboration with statewide stakeholders in education and practice.
- Lead initiatives to build strong and sustainable educational and development pathways that span the career continuum
- Continuously measure and evaluate program outcomes

Building on Existing Work

The Behavioral Health Workforce Initiative will:

- Employ fiscally responsible programs successful in other states at increasing behavioral health workforce, including increasing interest in behavioral health professions, supporting pipeline programming, increasing the numbers of graduates who provide behavioral health services, and retention of graduates in WV.
- Expand promising work funded by the WVHEPC and piloted by WV education institutions to address pipeline, education, and transition to practice initiatives.
- Support emerging and existing workforce initiatives related to the care of those with substance use disorder.
