In recent years, West Virginia has made several major economic announcements regarding new investments and expansions that mean more jobs for our people and the ushering in of a new economy.

But if we want to ensure the long-term success of these economic advancements and secure even more of them, we must provide the educated workforce that business and industries need.

However, West Virginia currently has one of the lowest college-going rates and one of the lowest workforce participation rates in the country. In fact, West Virginia's college-going rate - the percentage of graduating high school seniors who enroll in either a community college or a four-year institution - dipped to 45.9 percent for the graduating class of 2021, representing the lowest rate since our office started tracking this data.

We moved that number up slightly to 46.4 percent for the class of 2022, but there is still much work to do – especially considering that by 2030, West Virginia needs at least 60 percent of working-age West Virginians to have a postsecondary credential by 2030.

Throughout this year, I have had the opportunity to meet with high school students, administrators, counselors and teachers about both the progress and challenges facing students after graduation. This is something I always do, but I've had more of those conversations than ever before recently because of the low percentage of high school graduates continuing their education.

What we're hearing is that these young people don't know about the economic advancements our state has made. They don't believe job opportunities exist for them in their home state, and many of them also believe that a college education in West Virginia is unaffordable and out of reach.

So now, it's our job to show them that those career opportunities exist here, and that we can help them get the education or training needed to reach them.

First, in a historic move, this year the West Virginia Legislature adopted and Gov. Jim Justice signed legislation creating West Virginia's first-ever **statewide dual enrollment program.** As a result, our state is now funding – for the first time ever –

college courses for high school students. Without such support, what we have historically had is a system that favors our highest achieving, highest performing students — those who could afford the dual enrollment costs and were probably going to go to college anyway.



State-funded dual enrollment began this fall as a four-year pilot program, supporting up to an estimated 10,000 students per year. West Virginia's public community and technical colleges and four-year institutions are offering courses in certain designated career pathways, such as health care, information technology, advanced manufacturing, construction, engineering, education, agriculture, and any other program that meets a workforce need in the state as determined by the West Virginia Department of Commerce.

Through this legislation, we are opening new doors to low-income students and those who aren't quite sure about their futures. And by focusing this pilot program on academic courses linked to the most growing, in-demand jobs in the state, our hope is to place these students on the path to long-term, successful careers in the Mountain State.

Our dual enrollment program represents the latest investment by the state in making college more accessible and affordable for students. Remarkably, my office now administers more than \$100 million in state-sponsored financial aid each year. This includes the **West Virginia Invests grant**, our tuition-free community college program; the merit-based Promise Scholarship; and, the needs-based Higher Education Grant Program.



Through West Virginia Invests, which was passed by the Legislature in 2019, the top career tracks students are pursuing include nursing, business, health care, criminal justice, information technology, cybersecurity, aviation maintenance technology, welding, and electric utility technology. These are careers available now and careers that will carry

forward into the future, and I am so proud that our colleges are providing this workforce for employers.

We also have apprenticeship-type opportunities that are incredibly rewarding for both students and employers. Last year, the state's leading workforce development and educational partnership, **Learn & Earn**, distributed more than \$3 million to connect students with work opportunities through more than 80 businesses across the state.



Learn & Earn connects employers with students eager to gain valuable, paid experience in their fields of study. The program allows students to take technical courses while gaining paid work experiences and companies can meet their immediate staffing needs as they build a skilled workforce. Students' pay is shared 50/50 between the state and company. Companies are not required to hire the students upon graduation, but the program currently has a placement rate of more than 90 percent.

Through new programming like the historic dual enrollment pilot to vast financial aid opportunities and longstanding programs like Learn & Earn, West Virginia is undoubtedly investing more strongly in our citizens' education and West Virginia's workforce than ever before.

This is a testament to our state's commitment to a stronger future - and to taking full advantage of opportunities in our evolving economy.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS

COLLEGE APPLICATION AND EXPLORATION WEEK PROMOTES A COLLEGE-GOING CULTURE

More than 400 schools and organizations across West Virginia participated in College Application and Exploration Week (CAEW) from October 30th to November 3rd. This annual initiative is aimed at providing opportunities for students, educators, and community members to explore postsecondary and career pathways, helping to fuel a culture of college readiness across the state. Throughout the week, students took field trips to college campuses and participated in workshops on the college application process and financial aid opportunities, gaining valuable insights into the college–going process. Coordinated by College for West Virginia (CFWV), West Virginia's CAEW is supported by the work of the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission, the West Virginia Community and Technical College System, the West Virginia Department of Education, West Virginia GEAR UP, and West Virginia's TRIO programs.





CDL TRAINING PROGRAM MODERNIZATION **BRINGS ADVANCED SIMULATOR TECHNOLOGY TO** INSTITUTIONS ACROSS THE STATE

The West Virginia Community and Technical System modernized commercial drivers' license (CDL) training programs at six institutions across the state through the deployment of 14 cutting-edge commercial driving simulators. This driving simulator technology promises to be a game-changer in CDL education, offering students an immersive learning experience that replicates real-world challenges. Simulators enable students to practice vital skills that would be difficult to replicate in a traditional instructional setting, such as responding to flat tires, handling equipment failures, navigating hazardous weather conditions, and reacting to unpredictable situations caused by other drivers and wildlife. Moreover, the utilization of simulators will reduce operating and maintenance costs associated with CDL training, making it a more accessible and affordable option for aspiring truck drivers.



COMMUNITY AND TECHNICAL COLLEGES COMMIT TO PROVIDING FIVE-STAR CUSTOMER SERVICE

Through a grant from the Ascendium Foundation, eight West Virginia Community and Technical Colleges undertook an initiative to elevate the standard of customer service they provide to their students. The Council, in collaboration with SLC Higher Education, hosted the first-ever "Service Excellence Summer Institute," a week-long event aimed at training staff from each college to become certified service excellence campus trainers. More than 20 participants spent six intensive days learning about topics such as understanding the essence of service excellence in higher education, addressing enrollment and service expectation challenges, and strategies to alleviate the apprehension of first-generation students. The training also covered practical aspects, such as solving service problems with empathy, enhancing communication, and maintaining service standards in difficult situations. When they returned to their respective institutions, each team of newly certified trainers hosted a campus-wide training event for others in the campus community who serve primarily in customer service roles.













NEW PODCAST SHARES STORIES OF HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS ACROSS WEST VIRGINIA



The West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission, with support from the Claude Worthington Benedum Foundation, recently launched Appalachian Care Chronicles, a new podcast featuring first-person accounts from healthcare professionals across West Virginia. Hosted by Aryana Misaghi, a 2023 graduate of Marshall University's Joan C. Edwards School of Medicine, the podcast follows

WEST VIRGINIA AWARDED \$20 MILLION FROM NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION

West Virginia was awarded a highly competitive, five-year \$20 million grant from the National Science Foundation's Established Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR) that will boost academic scientific research and upgrade infrastructure at West Virginia University, Marshall University, West Virginia State University and Shepherd University. EPSCoR is facilitated by the Commission's Division of Science, Technology & Research (STaR). This funding establishes the West Virginia Network for Functional Neuroscience and Transcriptomics, a statewide collaboration of neuroscientists and bioinformaticists working to position West Virginia as a center for impactful neuroscience research.



WEST VIRGINIA HIGHER EDUCATION ALMANA

The 2023 West Virginia Higher Education Almanac provides year-end higher education statistics for both of the state's higher education systems, the West Virginia Higher Education Policy Commission (Commission) and West Virginia Council for Community and Technical College Education (Council).

When reviewing the statistics in this report, it is important to carefully consider the data definitions for each metric, which are found at the end of the document. This is particularly important when it comes to the cohort, or group of students, of which the statistic is reflective. For example, there are fundamental differences between "full-time" and "part-time" students that can have a drastic effect on the reported data.





TOP 5 DEGREE AREAS

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This list reflects the five most common fields of study based on the total number of undergraduate and graduate degrees awarded within an academic year. Fields of study are categorized using the U.S. Department of Education's Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) codes and associated disciplines.

STUDENT TO FACULTY RATIO

2021-22 Academic Year | Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)

This metric is calculated by dividing total full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment for students not enrolled in graduate or professional programs by total FTE for instructional staff not teaching in graduate or professional programs.

TOTAL ANNUAL HEADCOUNT

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

Annual headcount enrollment values represent the total number of unique students who enrolled in credit-bearing classes during the summer, fall and spring terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

DUAL ENROLLMENT HEADCOUNT

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure reflects the percentage of the institution's total annualized headcount enrollment that is comprised of high school students enrolled in college classes while still in high school.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) ENROLLMENT

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

Annualized Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment values represent the sum of all credit hours generated by undergraduate students enrolled in credit-bearing classes, divided by 30, and the sum of credit hours generated by graduate students in credit-bearing classes, divided by 24, during the summer, fall and spring terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

FALL FRESHMAN CLASS PROFILE

2022-23 Academic Year | Fall End-of-term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of first-time, full- and part-time, associate or bachelor's degree-seeking freshmen matriculating in the fall semester of an academic year. Featured characteristics include gender, race/ethnicity, West Virginia residency status, percentage scoring at or above college-ready benchmarks in the English and Math sections of the SAT (based only on those freshmen who submitted SAT scores), percentage receiving financial aid through the West Virginia PROMISE Scholarship or federal Pell Grant programs, and the percentage who earned college credit while in high school through programs such as dual enrollment, Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB).

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT PROFILE

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all credit-seeking undergraduate students within an academic year at a given institution.

MINORITY STUDENTS

Students with racial or ethnic minority status are those who self-identify as Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Black or African-American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, or multi-racial.

PART-TIME STUDENTS

A part-time student is defined as an undergraduate student enrolling in fewer than 12 credit hours, or a graduate student enrolling in fewer than 9 credit hours, in a semester.

FALL-TO-FALL RETENTION

Fall 2021 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled the following fall at the same institution.

FALL-TO-SPRING RETENTION

Fall 2022 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled in the spring semester of the same academic year at the same institution.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING 30 HOURS

Fall 2022 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who successfully completed 30 credit hours by the end of the following summer.

BACHELOR'S GRADUATION RATES (FOUR- AND SIX-YEAR)

Fall 2017 First-Time Full-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time full-time bachelor's degree-seeking freshmen in a fall entry cohort who earned a bachelor's degree at any public West Virginia institution within four and six years of initial enrollment.

DEGREES AWARDED

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

These values represent the total number of academic credentials at the certificate, associate, bachelor's, master's, post-master's certificate, and doctoral levels awarded by an institution within an academic year. Students earning multiple credentials within an academic year are counted more than once.

GRADUATING CLASS PROFILE

2022-23 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all bachelor's degree recipients within an academic year. The values for Potomac State College of WVU reflect associate degree earners. Gender, minority status and West Virginia residency status reflect all graduates. Academic characteristics including average college GPA, years to degree, and credit hours earned are calculated only for graduates who are earning their first bachelor's degree and have started as a first-time freshman at any public in-state institution.

FINANCIAL AID PARTICIPATION RATE

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure represents the percentage of students (excluding dual enrolled students) receiving federal, state, or institutional grants or waivers divided by the annual unduplicated headcount for the year, excluding dual enrollment. It does not include veterans' benefits, vocational rehabilitation benefits, other educational benefits, or loans, but does include work study.

GRADUATE INDEBTEDNESS

2022-23 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides data on the percentage of bachelor's degree earners within an academic year who graduated with student loan debt, along with the average total student loan debt that accumulated as of the student's graduation date. The values for Potomac State College of WVU reflect associate degree earners.

THREE-YEAR STUDENT LOAN DEFAULT RATE

2019 Repayment Cohort | U.S. Department of Education

This measure provides the percentage of a school's borrowers who entered repayment on certain Federal Family Education Loans and/or William D. Ford Federal Direct Loans in the 2019 fiscal year and entered default status within a three-year period. Potomac State College of WVU and WVU Institute of Technology rates are reported as part of the default rate for the main campus of WVU.

WORKFORCE OUTCOMES

2018 Graduates | Institutional Data Submissions; Workforce West Virginia

This section provides the percentage of all recent graduates who earned wages in West Virginia two and four years after graduation, and the median wages earned by bachelor's and master's degree recipients two and four years after graduation. The values for Potomac State College of WVU reflect associate degree earners. Median wages are calculated based on those graduates earning wages within all four quarters of a calendar year. These wages do not include graduates who are employed outside of West Virginia, are self-employed, did not earn wages in each of the four quarters of the calendar year, are clergy, are members of the military, or work for the federal government. To protect student privacy, workforce data may be suppressed or unpublished for institutions with small numbers of graduates in the workforce.

TOP 5 CERTIFICATES AND DEGREES AWARDED

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This list reflects the five most common fields of study based on the total number of academic certificates and associate degrees awarded within an academic year. Fields of study are categorized using the U.S. Department of Education's Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) codes and associated disciplines.

STUDENT TO FACULTY RATIO

2021-22 Academic Year | Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS)

This metric is calculated by dividing total full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment by total FTE for instructional staff.

TOTAL ANNUAL HEADCOUNT

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

Annual headcount enrollment values represent the total number of unique students who enrolled in credit-bearing classes or shortterm training (workforce development) programs during the summer, fall and spring terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

DUAL ENROLLMENT HEADCOUNT

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure reflects the percentage of the institution's total annualized headcount enrollment that is comprised of high school students enrolled in college classes while still in high school.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT (FTE) ENROLLMENT

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

Annualized Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment values represent the sum of all credit hours generated by students enrolled in creditbearing classes, divided by 30, during the summer, fall and spring terms in a given academic year at a specific institution.

FALL FRESHMAN CLASS PROFILE

2022-23 Academic Year | Fall End-of-term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of first-time, full- and part-time, certificate-, associate degree- or bachelor's degree-seeking freshmen matriculating in the fall semester of an academic year. Featured characteristics include gender, race/ethnicity, West Virginia residency status, percentage receiving financial aid through the federal Pell Grant program, and the percentage who earned college credit while in high school through programs such as dual enrollment, Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB).

STUDENT PROFILE

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all credit-seeking students within an academic year at a given institution, excluding students enrolled solely in SHORT-TERM TRAINING courses.

MINORITY STUDENTS

Students with racial or ethnic minority status are those who self-identify as Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Black or African-American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, or multi-racial.

PART-TIME STUDENTS

A part-time student is defined as an undergraduate student enrolling in fewer than 12 credit hours in a semester.

FALL-TO-FALL RETENTION

Fall 2021 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled the following fall at the same institution.

FALL-TO-SPRING RETENTION

Fall 2022 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who enrolled in the spring semester of the same academic year at the same institution.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING 15 HOURS IN FIRST SEMESTER

Fall 2022 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Fall End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who successfully completed 15 credit hours by the end of the fall semester.

FRESHMEN COMPLETING MATH/ENGLISH COREQUISITE COURSEWORK

Fall 2021 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who were required to enroll in a corequisite math or English course and successfully completed these courses within two years of enrollment.

TRANSFERRED TO BACHELOR'S PROGRAM

Fall 2021 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator represents the percentage of first-time freshmen in a fall entry cohort who were enrolled in a bachelor's degree program. by the end of the following academic year.

ASSOCIATE GRADUATION RATES (TWO- AND THREE-YEAR)

Fall 2020 First-Time Freshman Cohort | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This indicator reflects the percentage of first-time associate degree-seeking freshmen in a fall entry cohort who earned an associate degree at any public West Virginia institution within two and three years of initial enrollment.

DEGREES AWARDED

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

These values represent the total number of academic credentials at the certificate, associate and bachelor's levels awarded by an institution within an academic year. Students earning multiple credentials within an academic year are counted more than once.

GRADUATING CLASS PROFILE

2022-23 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides a summary of the academic and demographic characteristics of all associate degree recipients within an academic year. Gender, minority status and West Virginia residency status reflect all graduates. Academic characteristics including average college GPA, years to degree, and credit hours earned are calculated only for graduates who are earning their first associate degree and have started as a first-time freshman at any public in-state institution.

FINANCIAL AID PARTICIPATION RATE

2022-23 Academic Year | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This measure represents the percentage of students (excluding dual enrolled students) receiving federal, state, or institutional grants or waivers divided by the annual unduplicated headcount for the year, excluding dual enrollment. It does not include veterans' benefits, vocational rehabilitation benefits, other educational benefits, or loans, but does include work study.

GRADUATE INDEBTEDNESS

2022-23 Graduates | Summer, Fall and Spring End-of-Term Data

This section provides data on the percentage of associate degree earners within an academic year who graduated with student loan debt, along with the average total student loan debt that accumulated as of the student's graduation date.

THREE-YEAR STUDENT LOAN DEFAULT RATE

2019 Repayment Cohort | U.S. Department of Education
